

## CPD module (level 5) for Teachers of Maths GCSE resits at the College of West Anglia, Kings Lynn

This new blended learning programme, subsidised by the Education and Training Foundation, aims to support participants to develop the subject knowledge and subject-specific pedagogy required to teach learners who have not achieved a good pass in GCSE mathematics at school. This short **video** explains the rationale for developing this course. Participants will have an opportunity to:

- analyse factors that might disengage GCSE mathematics learners and explore strategies for motivating and inspiring them;
- evaluate and use approaches to initial and diagnostic assessment which actively involve learners in the process of assessment and target setting;
- plan an effective learning programme for GCSE mathematics courses;
- develop their personal mathematics knowledge and abilities to teach a GCSE mathematics programme;
- use a range of assessment for learning strategies and adapt teaching to meet the needs of individual learners; and
- reflect on their practice and identify ways to improve it.

### Who is this course for?

- Existing teachers who currently teach GCSE mathematics.
- New GCSE teachers who have previously led Functional Skills or mathematics/numeracy courses.
- Vocational teachers who have been supporting maths development and are preparing to teach GCSE mathematics.
- Teachers who have undertaken introductory GCSE training, such as the

Mathematics Enhancement Programme (MEP).

### Format

The course consists of five half day, face to face workshops and five web-based sessions, 1.00 pm – 4.00 pm, complemented by self-study.
